1. BSA HOLDS HANDS WITH SANABO TO HOST AFRICAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

oxing South Africa (BSA) has taken hands with South African National Boxing Organisation (SANABO) to host the African Championships named after of the late Dr. Nelson Rhalihlahla Mandela, "Mandela African Boxing Cup".

The Continental Competition is set to take place on the 09th – 14th of October 2023 at International Convention Centre, Durban, KwaZulu-Natal.

The IBA president Mr. Kremlev has committed to provide financial support for the delivery of the competition, including provision of free accommodation with meals for all participating national teams from the continent.

SANABO leadership has welcomed the project, recognizing the role our global icon played in liberating our country, whilst promoting worldwide peace and stability. SANABO views this award as a privilege and hopes that it will play a role restoring the name of our icon and as well promoting developmental boxing in the country.

All champions from this cup will form part of an African team that will later compete against other continents. There will also be International training courses for the coaches and technical officials that will happen alongside this competition.

International Boxing Association (IBA)
Board of Directors will host its meeting in
Durban and later form part of the event.



The sequence of events is as follows:

- Arrival of teams: 06 08 October 2023
- Opening ceremony: 08 October 2023
- Competition: 09 14 October 2023
- African Congress: 13 October 2023
- Finals and closing ceremony: 14 October 2023
- Departure: 15 October 2023

nother jam-packed weekend saw two series events taking place in Limpopo and Gauteng on 29 and 30 September 2023 respectively.

Considering empowering and women in the sport boxing, The Rise of Women in Boxing Series Three, which took place in Limpopo at the Meropa Casino, saw female fighters displaying their skills in the ring.

The Limpopo Series, hosted by Mama Rocks Promotions, set the stage for female boxers in what was pure entertainment with six bouts. Sharadine Fortuin earned the Bantamweight title in a bruising battle against Zimbabwe's Patience Mustarathe for the international headline fight.

The exhilarating eight-round battle saw Fortuin win the belt by unanimous points.

"Today I feel so great that I won the fight," said Fortuin.


"I made a statement that I'm going to win, and so I did. I'd like to thank my manager for being there for me, my team for helping me through the preparations and my promotions for giving me this opportunity today."

The main supporting bout was one to remember as Malawian warrior Adidya Mimu outclassed Lufuno Mutshayi, to win in the fourth round by TKO.

Female promoter Modipadi Kgasago of Mama Rocks promotion said she was grateful for the opportunity.

In another bout, Bukiwe Nonina was knuckling up with Chiedza Homakoma, the fight ended in a technical draw after they both suffered an accidental headbutt.

3. SAMBU WINS WBF INTER-CONTINENTAL BANTAMWEIGHT TITLE IN A CONTORVESIAL BOUT

retoria was in for the spoils as Studdard and Fantastic Two Boxing promotion, in partnership with BSA, staged an exciting sparring event on Sunday 1 October 2023.

The main bout saw Akani Sambu win the vacant World Boxing Federation (WBF) Intercontinental Bantamweight title, defeating Joshua Studdard by unanimous decision.


While it was an entertaining fight with well experienced boxers, it was not without any drama as Studdard was incorrectly announced as the winner by split-decision.


Sambu dominated the first six rounds, but Studdard gave the last, lasting impression when he woke up towards the end and chased down Sambu in the last rounds.

Things almost ended in controversy, Studdard was incorrectly announced as the winner because of two judges filling in their scorecards incorrectly. However, the decision was recalled.

The Gauteng Boxing Provincial Manager Mr. Lehlohonolo Ramagole has thanked the leadership who jumped in to make correct amendments.

"Joshua (Studdard) might have taken the later rounds; he was on top for the last three rounds, but from the beginning of the fight – first to sixth round Akani (Sambu) already had it in the bag and he had to survive for him to win.





The correct scores were 117-111, 115-114 and 115-113 for Sambu.

Mr. Ramagole was left impressed by the tournament staged by Studdard and Fantastic Two Boxing promotion in partnership with BSA and provincial government.

The events saw several sponsorships coming to party according to Ramagole.

"Yesterday's tournament happened in one of the biggest clubs in the country and it went successfully, there were no problems or fights among the spectators," the Gauteng Boxing Provincial Manager explained.



4. NGXEKE BEATS QUIBIDO IN A WBO GLOBAL BANTAMWEIGHT TITLE

Xaba promotions, side by side with BSA, hosted another successful event when they stage their 4th annual heritage celebration on Sunday 1 October, in East London Orient Theatre.

Another boxing event with exciting sparring line-up saw Landile "Man Down" Ngxeke snatch the WBO Global Bantamweight title against Denmark Quibido in unanimous decision, after a fight of ten rounds.

Ngxeke beat Quibido in the same venue where he was crowned IBO Intercontinental junior bantamweight champion after topping Michael Mendoza during a 12-round unanimous points decision, early this year.

"Man Down" has hailed his opponent strength that took him by surprise.

"The fight did not go as I initially thought, I thought I was going to finish him in the fifth round, but he proved to be a good strong fighter. He is not just a mere boxer, and he is fit," said Ngxeke.

Ayanda Matiti, of the Xaba promotion, acknowledged that the Philippine born Quibido gave Ngxeke a tough fight for the title.

"Yes, it was a difficult fight but "Man Down" needed to close the ring, not to follow him and when he started doing that, the boy from abroad was clear that he had enough and was careful not to prolong the fight," Matiti explained.

Matiti also announced that "Man Down" is vacating his South African Junior Bantamweight title.

"With respect to "Man Down" I think he has settled enough now in the Bantamweight division, remember he is a sitting South African Junior Bantamweight champion, and we are officially announcing that he is vacating that South African title," said Matiti.

5. IBF LIGHT-FLYWEIGHT WORLD CHAMPION NONTSHINGA READY TO DEFEND THE TITLE

outh Africa's pride, the IBF light-flyweight world champion Sivenathi "The Special One" Nontshinga is raring for his upcoming bout that will be staged on the 4th of November 2023.

Nontshinga will be looking to defend his world title against Mexican boxer, Adrian Curiel Dominguez in Monte Carlo, Monaco, and this quest will be the second one for him.

The 24-year-old who is the only South African fighter to hold one of the main organisation belts, is confident to retain his crown.

"I'm defending my title, it's voluntary defence, I'll be fighting with boxer Adrian Curiel Domingue from Mexico. I have seen him, I have watched a lot of his tapes, I won't disrespect him. I respect him like any other athlete. This is a game, at end of day it is unpredictable, but I promise everybody that I will get inside the ring fit – mentally, spiritually and physically, and yah once again I will defend my title," said Nontshinga.

With an impressive unbeaten career record, the South African Boxer of the Year retained the IBF title against the mandatory challenger Ritchie Suganob from Philippine, in East London, in July this year. And heading to knuckle up in Monaco, Nontshinga remains confident in his hard work and the preparations that are on track.


"I did not rest; I think I spent two weeks at home, then I came back to gym and yah I am still working hard as you can see that I am in shape. So we have started preparations and so far so good, the weight is fine, we started with a diet because I believe we only have five weeks to go," Nontshinga concluded.
