TERMS OF PURSE BIDS FOR SA NATIONAL TITLE CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. The prescripts of the Boxing Act No.11 of 2011 and Boxing Regulations, 2004 apply, and these provide the rules applicable to the contest.
2. Purse bids are open to all BSA licensed Promoters who are in good standing with BSA and not undergoing any internal disciplinary proceedings. It is incumbent upon the Promoter to disclose any such to BSA. Failure to disclose will be viewed in a serious light by BSA and may disqualify the Promoter's participation in the purse bid.
3. Promoters shall pay a non-refundable fee of R500 (five hundred rand) to participate in the Purse Bids process.
4. The Purse Bids process shall not be affected by any existing or mooted promotional agreements in which any Promoter, who participates or not in the purse bids, has contractual obligations with this or the other boxer. The purse bids process, for remedial purposes of the contested bout, supersedes such agreements.
5. All purse bids must be submitted in sealed and clearly marked envelopes and in accordance with the directions given in the purse bids notice.
6. Purse bids must be stated in South African Rand only.
7. The purse for each boxer must be paid nett of any taxes or any other fees that may be necessary for the Promoter to host such a bout. No deductions of any kind other than the cost of medical examinations necessary to obtain a licence from the regulatory institution.

PROMOTER'S DEPOSIT AFTER WINNING THE BID

8. A promoter who becomes the ultimate winner in the Purse Bids process must, within the allotted number of days, deposit to BSA 15% of the total purse offer. Failure to comply with this requirement will result in the Promoter forfeiting his/her right to promote the contest and the opportunity passing on to the second highest bidder.
9. If the winning Promoter withdraws from the contest, for any reason whatsoever, all fees already paid in relation to the purse bid will be forfeited. Disposal of such fees will be determined by BSA and all or a portion of may be claimed as compensation by either boxer.
10. The successful Promoter must provide for accommodation, food (3 meals per day), access to gym, weighing facilities and transportation to and from the hotel, weigh-in venue, press conferences, tournament, and pick-up to and from hotel on arrival and departure, where applicable. In the case of a domestic boxer, this will be for the day

of the weigh-in, the day of the contest and the day after the contest. In the case of an overseas boxer this will be for at least 5 days before the contest and the next day afterwards. In both case the cost of travel will be for a minimum of 2 persons, i.e. the Boxer and Trainer/Second/Manager.

BOXERS' OBLIGATIONS IN THE PURSE BIDS PROCESS

11. It is incumbent upon both boxers to participate in the scheduled contest and non-participation may be perceived as an act of insolence which may be followed by corrective action.
12. Both boxers must ensure that they are fit to box, comply with all necessary licencing requirements and assist the Promoter with all reasonable requirements with regard to promotion and publicity of the fight, e.g. the provision of photos and attendance at press conferences.
13. Either boxer may withdraw from the contest prior to the opening of purse bids by informing the BSA of such decision in writing. In the case of a champion, this act will be perceived as the champion having voluntarily forfeited the title resulting in BSA declaring the title vacant. In the case of a challenger, this act will be the perceived as the challenger having forfeited the privilege and status of an available challenger and result in the loss of that status. Either boxer withdrawing after the opening of bids may face further penalties.

DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY

14. The BSA Chairperson or his designated official shall have the authority to resolve any matter regarding purse bids. Such a designee will have discretionary powers to act and will also be empowered to mete out punitive measures to would-be offenders and miscreants alike. At all times, the designee will be expected to act in the interest of transparency, fairness, and equality in sport.
